





Introduction to the World of the New Testament



This course has been remastered from Select Learning's larger *Introduction to the New Testament* with a study guide written specifically for congregational use. 

How Lutherans Interpret The Bible



Lutherans are unique in their approach to theology. Despite the theological divisions between the Lutheran denominations, Lutherans share a significant body of agreement on issues of biblical interpretation.

Dr. Mark Allen Powell, a Lutheran pastor and Bible Professor at Trinity Lutheran Seminary presents how Lutherans interpret the Bible. Dr. Powell's insights on the Bible are

shared through seven sessions and offer views for Bible studies and interpretations for multiple denominations of the Christian faith.

Teaching The Bible, Hosting The Conversation



Are you a rostered minister? A Book of Faith Advocate? A Christian Ed Director? A small group study leader? Looking for material to enhance your teaching skills or support others who are teachers?

Teaching and learning the Bible is one of the primary faith formation practices for Christians. This course helps support the development of teaching skills, by explor-




ing the many facets of the church's ministry of teaching, especially as it relates to the Bible. Focusing primarily on teaching adults, individual sessions examine the dynamics of adult learning, methodology, designing teaching/learning experiences, pastoral implications of teaching the Bible, multi-cultural considerations in exploring biblical texts, and the use of media in teaching. The course consists of six units, with four 20-minute sessions per unit.

Introduction To The New Testament



The New Testament is a diverse collection of accounts, letters and prophetic literature. These texts are nuanced, sophisticated and sometimes seemingly at odds in their witness to God in Christ. Instructors Dr. Ray Pickett, Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago, Dr. Sarah Henrich, Luther Seminary, and Dr. Rick Carlson, Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg, help viewers

tease out the rich themes and subtext of these core scriptures for disciples of Jesus.

Learners are introduced to key themes and issues in the study of the New Testament, and learn basic skills to equip them to be competent and creative interpreters of New Testament texts. This course presents a model for interpreting Scripture that emphasizes the importance of reading New Testament texts in their cultural and literary contexts with a view to relating them to contemporary cultural and ministry contexts. Focus is given to the practice of interpreting New Testament texts. Students will use the models and insights from the presentations to explore questions raised by the study of specific New Testament texts and then discuss how these texts continue to shape our faith and practice in today's world.



Introduction To The Old Testament



The vast majority of the Bible is the Old Testament, yet it is often the least understood part of God's Word. Ancient names. Distant places. Harsh words of judgment and violence. Unlikely historical events. A mish-mash of wisdom, poetry, stories, prophecy and chronicles. Many think of it either as "The Law" or as a warm-up act for "The Gospel" found in the New Testament. Yet



God's fingerprints of grace and hope are all over the Old Testament, and with a little expert help, the mysteries and riddles of this vast witness can be unraveled and made accessible. And that's exactly what this course does. Each of the ten units in this course has four 20-minute sessions. It introduces students to the high points of the Old Testament:

Deuteronomic History (Joshua-Kings)



Adult Crossings: God's Journey with Us



The Bible contains hundreds of stories – thousands of names. How does a person begin to understand and remember it all?



Learning Luke: The Apostolic Gospel

Learning Luke explores the third gospel to learn how God calls the church into a new era of apostolic mission.

Your congregational groups, lay leadership program, and pastoral team will learn together as you seek a richer understanding of what Luke's whole story means to you, using as many of the twelve sessions as you

The sessions are designed to appreciate Luke's unique telling of the story of Jesus, to mark how deeply Luke's account is grounded in the scriptures of Israel, and to learn from the evangelist's conviction that God's Messiah is alive. 

The Beginning of the Good News: A Live Presentation of Mark's Gospel




The first Christians heard the stories about Jesus; they didn't read them. This presentation allows 21st century Christians to experience the gospel just as the early Christians would have: in performance.


The Dramatic Presentation of Paul's Letter to the Galatians

This seven-session course provides a much-needed, truly biblical perspective on what is arguably the most difficult book of the Bible.



The New Testament documents are central to the Christian faith and to historic Christianity. By ecumenical consensus among all Christian traditions, the New Testament is central to the faith, life, and worship of the church. It is the word of God and it conveys the word of God. Even as the New Testament is central to all Christian traditions, interpretations of these texts often vary widely. This makes for a rich and fascinating







Prophetic Faith:

Preparing Your Church to Advocate Social Justice

Many church goers steer away from controversy. They come to church to be comforted and comfortable; not stirred up. Others feel strongly about community and social issues but are afraid of causing conflict in the church. 
Prophetic Faith begins with four simple ideas:

An American Conscience: The Reinhold Niebuhr Story



Although he may be best remembered today as the author of the famed "Serenity Prayer," Reinhold Niebuhr — an outspoken American-born pastor, writer, and political activist — remains one of the most influential public theologians of our time. Presidents from Barack Obama to Jimmy Carter have credited his impact on their thinking, as well as John McCain, countless historians, theologians,

political thinkers, and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who cited Niebuhr in his "Letter from a Birmingham Jail."


Niebuhr rose from a small Midwest church pulpit to become the nation's moral voice — an American conscience — during some of the most defining moments in recent history. His books, Moral Man and Immoral Society (1932), The Nature and Destiny of Man (1941–43) and The Irony of American History (1952), continue to influence theological and political thinking. An American original, his unique insights into human nature and its relationship to political movements and social justice propelled him to speak openly, and often critically, to an America consumed by moral certainty. For Niebuhr the priority was always justice, his guiding principle was hope in a redeemer God, and his weapon was an extraordinary gift for clarity of thought that made him a leading voice of conscience for his time.

Knowledge to Power: Understanding and Overcoming Addiction

There is not one congregation and probably not one family that has not been affected tragically by the disease of addiction, whether that is by drugs, alcohol, tobacco, food, gambling, sex or computer/game/I-phone addiction. There is now an understandable, yet comprehensive treatment of this problem in this DVD, *Knowledge to Power: Understanding and Overcoming Addiction*. The presenter is Rev. Kal W. Rissman, who has




worked with addictions his entire career as addiction counselor, nicotine dependency counselor, hospital chaplain and parish pastor. The series is comprised of 21 sessions of about 18 minutes each on everything from the disease to codependency to intervention and to the role of religion in recovery. This resource includes a study guide with synopsis of each topic and discussion questions.

This resource is very usable for Bible studies, men's groups, women's groups or special congregational education. It also can be used by pastors for continuing education credits.

Knowledge to Power offers not only hope for those afflicted with the disease, but also for those affected by the disease in their family. It also includes some very practical solutions for this baffling problem.

Getting Down To Basics: The Augsburg Confession and Small Catechism



For Lutherans, The Book of Concord provides the definitive collection of their confessions of faith, including the all-important Augsburg Confession and Small and Large Catechisms. This ten-unit course has three 15-30 minute sessions each. It provides an overview of the historical development of all the documents in The Book of Concord, as well as in-depth looks at their

theology, focusing particularly on the Augsburg Confession and Luther's Catechisms.


Learners will discover the basic doctrinal commitments of the Lutheran Confessions and how they may apply in contemporary parish settings. This course provides a lively, down-to-earth examination of central Lutheran teachings such as justification by grace through faith on account of Christ, the distinction between law and gospel, the theology of the cross, the church and public ministry, the sacraments, and Christian callings in daily life. Students will gain new insight into the basics of Lutheran teaching and how it can strengthen their faith and witness today. Students will become thoroughly familiar with the two texts, understand the historical and theological context out of which they speak, and discover new ways to apply these teaching to life in today's parish. 



Do you ever wonder why we have so many Christian denominations and if there is really much difference between them?
